

MEMORANDUM D7-3-8

Ottawa, July 1, 1982

SUBJECT

GOODS PURCHASED BY CANADIAN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

This Memorandum prescribes a special form of waiver of drawback claim that is to be obtained from government departments by importers and manufacturers of goods when a government department is entitled to claim a drawback. The standard form of waiver is not acceptable in such cases.

GUIDELINES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Waiver of rights to Drawback by Canadian Government Departments

1. A claim for drawback in respect of Canadian government department purchases shall be accompanied by the original signed instruction given by the contracting department with the concurrence of the Treasury Board of Canada, to the effect that rights to drawback accruing in connection with the particular contract are duly waived to the claimant contractor.
2. An instruction as above once submitted need only be "referred to" in connection with the acceptance of any subsequent drawback claim related to the same contract.
